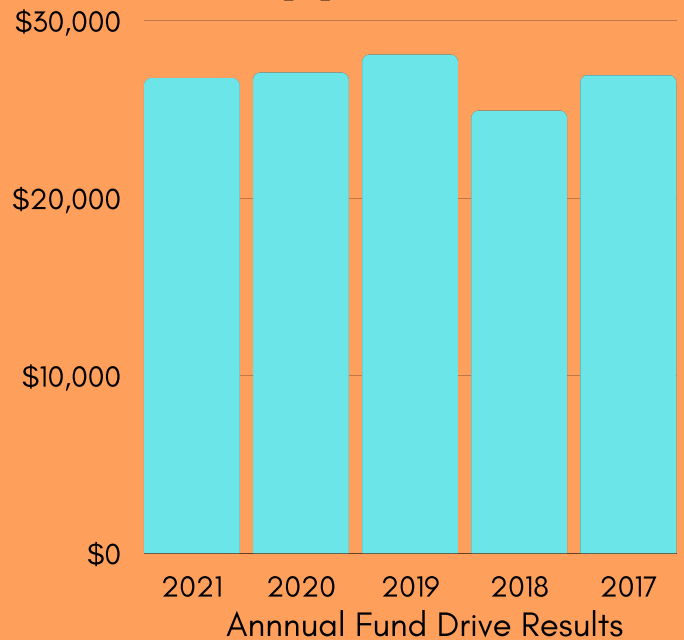


The Library leveraged a community grant through Thompson Health to start a Community Garden!

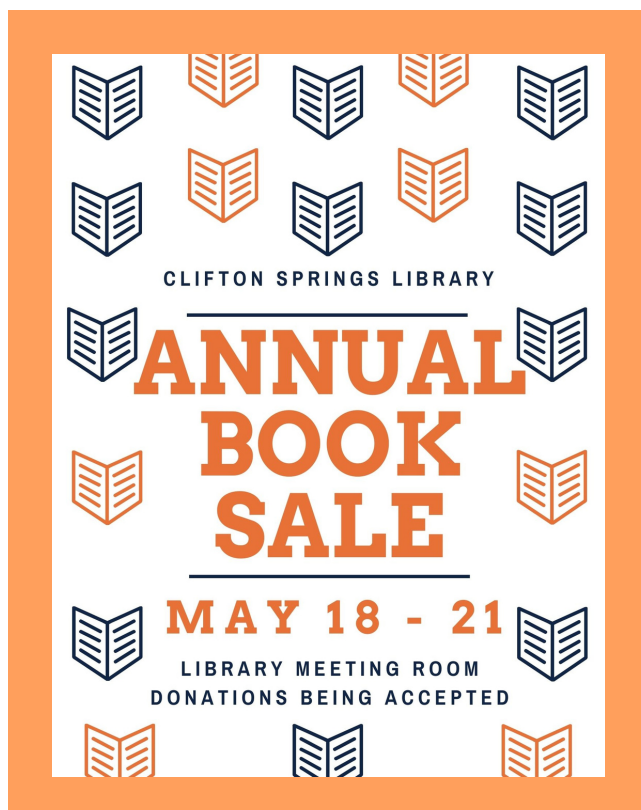

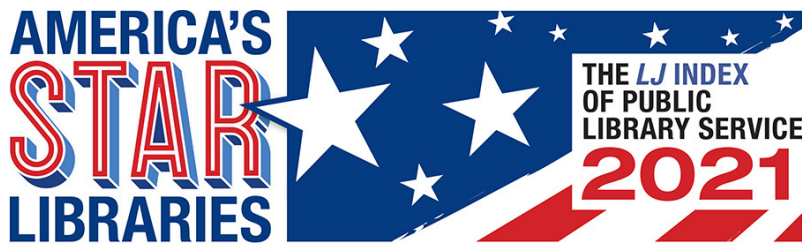
